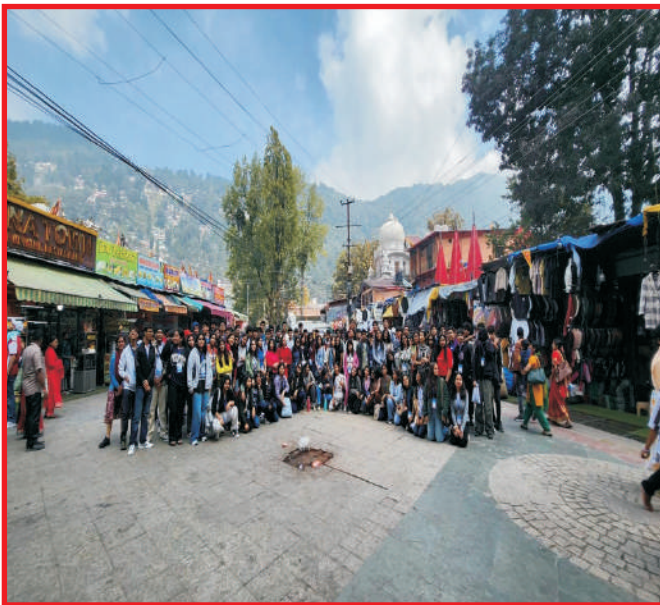
ACHIEVEMENTS

Ranthambore Expedition: Exploring Horizons

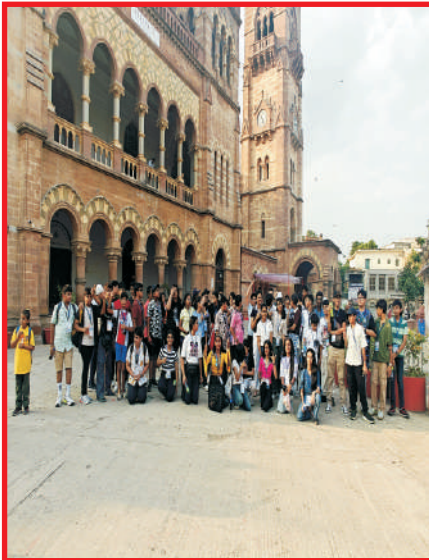
