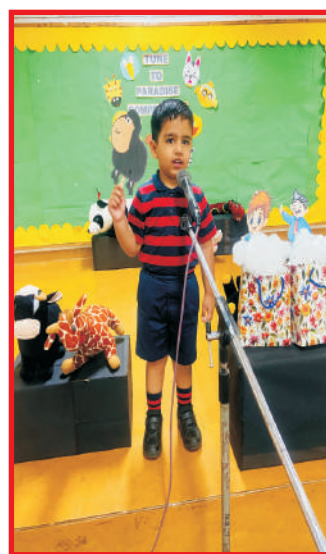

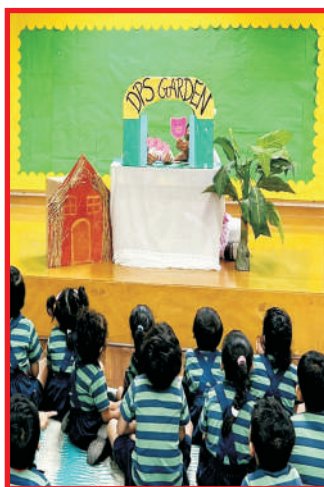


Kathakaar
